1. Attached is the Office of the City Mayor Memorandum Order No. 16 Series of 2024 titled Intensified Dengue Prevention and Control due to a significant increase in dengue cases with the following objectives:

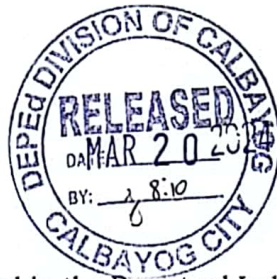
Heads of Schools and Campuses:

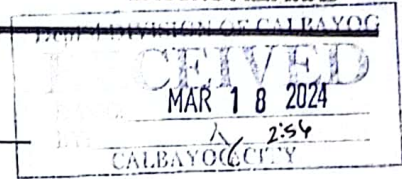

MEMORANDUM ORDER No. 16

TO: All Concerned Departments and Barangay Officials
FROM: Office of the City Mayor
SUBJECT: INTENSIFIED DENGUE PREVENTION AND CONTROL

WHEREAS, the data of Calbayog City reveals a significant increase in dengue cases for the year 2024 compared to the same period in 2023, reaching an alarming level that indicates a potential outbreak.

WHEREAS, the province of Samar has declared a Code White alert for dengue, necessitating Calbayog City to align its alert level with the province.

WHEREAS, the escalating trend of dengue cases coupled with the forecasted El Niño phenomenon by PAGASA requires immediate and intensified interventions to prevent further spread.

WHEREAS, adherence to the prescribed protocol for vector-borne disease prevention, following WHO guidelines, is imperative to safeguard public health.

THEREFORE, in response to the aforementioned circumstances, the following orders and objectives are hereby established:

1. OBJECTIVES:

- a. To maintain zero identified cases for dengue fever, dengue hemorrhagic fever, and dengue hemorrhagic shock in Calbayog City.
- b. To ensure zero mortality due to dengue hemorrhagic fever and dengue hemorrhagic shock.
- c. To collaborate with all stakeholders for a synchronized and intensified dengue intervention involving all sectors.

2. SCHEME OF IMPLEMENTATION:

A. City Health Office:

- a. Provide real-time morbidity data to the public through the city epidemiology and surveillance unit.
- b. Establish dengue and fever fast lanes for consultations.
- c. Offer free laboratory and diagnostic tests for dengue.
- d. Supervise larval surveys, health promotion, and community-based surveillance.
- e. Monitor data from larval surveys and provide technical assistance to barangays.
- f. Conduct oral rehydration for suspected dengue cases.

B. Barangay Councils:

- a. Organize and convene barangay health boards for early intervention.
- b. Activate health response teams for larval surveys, fever surveillance, and 5S interventions.

- c. Participate in simultaneous clean-up drives, search and destroy operations, and larvicide applications.
- d. Assign and train insecticide sprayers when needed.
- e. Perform color-coded house tagging based on larval survey results.
- f. Advocate for stakeholder cooperation.
- g. Regularly submit reports to DILG and CPIO.

C. DILG Office and CDRRMO:

- a. Facilitate monitoring of dengue prevention strategies, larval surveys, and actual cases.

D. Heads of Schools and Campuses:

- a. Activate dengue task forces.
- b. Join stakeholders in clean-up drives and interventions.
- c. Facilitate appropriate referral of students with early signs of infection.
- d. Submit documentation of interventions to CPIO.

E. Day Care Teachers (City Proper Barangays):

- a. Request the allocation of Ollyset nets for day care centers.
- b. Conduct search and destroy for breeding places within classrooms or day care centers.

F. National Government Offices, GOCC Offices, NGOs, Private Establishments, LGU-Hired Employees:

- a. Participate in simultaneous clean-up drives and interventions every Wednesday.

3. PERIOD OF IMPLEMENTATION:

All activities shall continue until the Code White alert level has been lifted at the regional level.

This memorandum order is effective immediately. All concerned departments and barangay officials are instructed to comply with the specified interventions to ensure the successful prevention and control of dengue in Calbayog City.
